The best places to store quilts are cabinets, closets, or quilt storage chests. Can you store a quilt in plastic?

Never store quilts in plastic for long periods of time. Fabric needs to breathe and the gasses produced by plastic can discolor and deteriorate fabric. Plastics to avoid include dry cleaning bags, heavy duty garbage bags, garment bags and Styrofoam. Moisture can ruin a quilt, so just to be sure, use a desiccant to absorb any moisture in the air.
